Eagle Lake History

Meg's dad, Mark Wolthuis, used to tell stories of riding his bike through the 3rd lake for his paper route. That is how low and dry the lake was in the 60's. In the following years, a couple families (Wolthuis family included) petitioned to get a pump installed. These families had to take a loan out to pay for the lake pump.

Meg's neighbor growing up, Bob Okeley (now deceased) gave her photos of the Island causeway being built in 1952. He said



that when people would drive into "town" they would pick up junk like old tires, bikes, blocks etc. to build up the area between the 1st lake and 3rd lake. Eventually they had enough junk to bring dirt in and make a road.

Meg's Grandpa, Al Wolthuis, who lived on Eagle Lake for many, many years, would often say, "It doesn't cost anything to wave." She still remembers him out by his barn and each person that would drive by, her Grandpa would simply raise his hand and wave. He might not even look up; he'd just raise his hand and wave. Included is the 2020 year- end revenue and expenses for our Association's account, and the data for the SAD #1 and SAD #2 accounts, which are administered by TT. The SAD accounts are not yet audited. On the next page we provide the SAD Budgets for 2021, including SAD #1, which continues in a suspended mode.

We sent out the invoices for your 2021 membership in ELTA. Respond early and help the Membership committee reach this year's target. If you have any questions, my e-mail address is james.caporale@gmail.com

Included here are the SAD Budgets as we know them today. Both budgets have already been reviewed by the Texas Township Board. The accounts are currently be audited and the results may impact the 2020 ending balances, but we believe them to be very close to accurate.

The SAD #1 Budget continues in the suspended mode for 3 years, which also mirrors the life cycle of the new SAD for the pumping operation. Our existing carry-over funds will enable us to treat for

weeds, but only on a limited basis again in 2021 and also in 2022.

The SAD #2 Budget is similar to the budget proposed in 2020. Last year we had planned to relocate most of the compressors that were located close to the water's edge, but once again the high water continued to prevent that from happening. Money has again been budgeted to relocate the equipment to a safer, and more lasting position. Since the budget of \$25,000.00 for re-installation of equipment is a worst case estimate, the LQAC think we will be able to manage it to a lower cost. On a positive note, we should be able to stay close to our original bio-augmentation plan, in spite of this non-normal equipment relocation cost.

We have not yet approved an Association budget; but, we will manage our normal expenses conservatively, and continue to remain financially strong. The Board is committed to being at the ready to do whatever it takes to keep our members up to date with the appropriate communications or other actions.

Lake Weed Treatment

Restorative Lake Sciences (RLS) will do the 2021 spring survey sometime in either May or April. Based on their report, PLM Lake and Land Management (PLM) will treat for weeds accordingly.

Aeration Shutdown

Currently, Eagle Lake is down approximately 30 inches from its highest level from the flooding. We have about 20 inches remaining to get to our target level. We plan to do an aeration survey of our 16 sites in May to assess whether PLM will be able to restart the aeration compressors. Hopefully, the lake level will be down sufficiently so that our aeration system will be started back up in 2021.

Bio-augmentation Treatment

Whether the aeration system is restarted or not in 2021, we still expect to do a normal bio-augmentation treatment.

Goose Abatement Program


Our goose abatement program was shutdown in 2020 by the state of Michigan due to covid concerns. If the state program resumes, we will resubmit our application and have a goose roundup in 2021.

Purple Loosestrife

The Purple Loosestrife program has been suspended for 2 years because of the flooding. Given the uncertainty of the location of new emerging Purple Loosestrife plants, we do not anticipate restarting the program in 2021.

Long Term Solution Update

We just received notice that the attorney for the Kalamazoo Drain Office will be filing the legal lake level (LLL) petitions for Eagle and Crooked Lakes in Kalamazoo Circuit Court on 9 Feb 2021. Concurrently with the petition filing, the Drain office will be mailing notices of this action to all affected property owners within the proposed assessment district. Once the petition has been filed, the Drain Office will release the engineering lake study completed by Prein&Newhof. Although there are separate lake petitions going to Circuit Court, the Drain Office intends to combine the hearing since both petitions are co-dependent. In addition, the Drain Office authorized Prein&Newhof this past December to begin the final design process for the project. Given that authorization, Prein&Newhof believes construction will start in fall of 2021.



Also, the Drain office has worked with the Township to obtain property easements for the planned route of underground piping.

Since our short term pumping will end about June in 2021, achieving the long term solution is paramount. With this latest action by the Drain office on the LLL

petitions, we are further on the path to reaching a final solution to flooding on Eagle Lake. Although things are looking good at the moment, we must remain vigilant. To that end, Steve Ott is leading the public information effort for ELTA for the anticipated community public hearings that lie ahead.

ICE SAFETY REMINDERS

We have been blessed (or cursed) with a pretty mild Michigan winter so far, depending on your love/hate for winter conditions. There's been activity on the ice from fishermen, skaters, snowmobiles, and everything in between. Accordingly, your board thought it prudent to publish some ice safety reminders to help keep your family and neighbors safe.

- We are making strides towards a normal lake-level, but we still have a way to go and many homes are still battling water intrusion. Please be mindful that many homes are still pumping into the lake. Ice will be weaker where there's moving water, creating potentially hazardous areas – especially near the shore where most discharge pipes will be.
- Some folks have bubblers, blowers, and other mechanical devices in the water to help aerate. Similar to sump pumps, this can create weak spots in the ice. These are most likely to be operating near the shore or surrounding "swim area."
- We've all heard people say things like "2 inches of ice is safe for skating or fishing." However, the simple fact is that not all ice is created equally and it's always best to err on the side of caution. The strongest ice is clear with a bluesish tint. Be extra cautious on ice that has slush on top of it. According to EGLE, there's no rule of thumb for what thickness is "safe".
- Avoid areas of ice with protruding objects like debris, logs, or brush.
- Always exercise caution when traversing areas of the ice that you are unfamiliar with.
- Always test the ice in several spots with a spud or auger because ice thickness and quality can vary wildly on the lake.
- When possible, go out with others or use the "buddy system."
- Make sure someone knows where you are and when you plan to be home.

Let's have a safe and fun winter season!


